## Worship during August



During August, Eucharist services will continue to be provided by our sister church, the [Church of the Ascension](#), Cadenabbia, photographed above, on Lake Como, and by [St Edward's Church](#), Lugano.

Between 19 August and 16 September, the Lake Como Landscape Museum is holding an exhibition telling the story of the Church of the Ascension including a display of paintings by twenty renowned contemporary artists. The completed works will be for sale after a London exhibition at Gurr John Gallery in Pall Mall from 13 to 17 November 2023.

On Sunday 20th August there is a 'bring your own' picnic lunch in the Parco Teresio Olivelli (opposite the museum) after church, followed by a visit to the museum to see the exhibition.

From Milano Centrale on Sundays, a Swiss Railways train leaves at 8.43 arriving Lugano at 9.58, with a short walk down the hill to the church. Return trains are at 12.02 and 13.02.

Travel to Cadenabbia can be by train and ferry, leaving Milano Centrale at 8.20 for Varenna, then a ferry at 9.45 to Cadenabbia arriving 10.00.
