This week we celebrate the birth of the Blessed Virgin Mary, on 8 September, 9 months after we celebrated the immaculate conception on 8 December. Christianity celebrates few births, but those that are celebrated – notably Our Lord, John the Baptist and Mary, Mother of Our Lord – have divine presence during conception or before birth.

According to St Andrew of Crete, the whole of creation is jubilant on this special day because the birth of Mary is a joyful prelude to the gift of humanity's salvation through Our Lord Jesus.

Diocese lay learning course

The Diocese in Europe's lay learning course 'Walking Together in Faith' is back for a second year, starting in September.

The course consists of four modules, each with five sessions.

Module One, 'Knowing God', explores prayer, taking the Lord's Prayer as our starting point, and asks what it meant to pray this fundamental Christian prayer in the time of Jesus and what it means today.

The course comprises fortnightly online sessions lasting 90 minutes, led by Diocesan Director of Lay Discipleship Dr Claire Amos. All participants can choose the level of engagement that suits them.

Those who complete the whole course and wish to submit work for assessment will be awarded a Bishop's Certificate. The course is free for all participants, but there will be a small cost for anyone working towards the Certificate.

The online sessions start on the evening of **26 September** (Final time to be announced when we know the range of time zones represented in the group).
